FOR GUYS: No speedos or tank top undershirts. Sleeveless shirts should not be low-cut (baring the chest from a side view). Guys wear shirts when traveling to and from swimming areas.

FOR GIRLS: Modest 1-piece bathing suit. No spagnetti strap or thin-strapped tank-tops. Shirts need to cover the stomach. Fingertip-length shorts.

How To Register You can now register online! Go to wondervalleycamp.com and click: On-line Registration

You may also register by filling out the attached form and mailing it to the camp office. Sign up for all events you wish to attend on one form — only one person per form. For additional registration forms, you may make photo copies, contact your church, or the camp office. You can also download forms from our website at wondervalleycamp.com. We ask you to please register for the event which corresponds to the school grade you will be entering in the fall. All registrations must be sent in with a non-refundable pre-registration fee which will be deducted from your total camp fee. Postmark your registration by May 20th and receive a \$5 discount on most events!

Bring a friend who is a first time camper to your event and receive a \$10 discount off your registration fee! Your friend will also receive \$10 off their registration. You and your friend's registrations must be sent together. Also indicate their name on your form. This discount is not available for all events. Check event descriptions.

Cancellations If you find you are unable to attend after you have sent in your registration, please contact the camp at least two weeks prior to that event so we can arrange for another camper to fill your place.

Notice: To campers and guests about registration day For the safety of campers and guests, all vehicles will be directed where to park, and a shuttle will be provided where necessary. Driving through the camparounds will be restricted. All campers will have a health screening by camp staff before they will be allowed to check in. The screening consists of a temperature check, lice check, and turning over all medication to the camp nurse.











Camp Rules The camper who is unable or unwilling to abide by these rules should not enroll and may be dismissed from camp.

- 1. Each camper and faculty member will follow the schedule unless excused by the dean.
- NO ONE, faculty or campers, is permitted to leave the camp property without permission of the dean.
- The use or possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, or tobacco is prohibited. Visitors are requested to refrain from using such while on the camp property.
- Automobiles are to be locked and parked in specified areas only. Campers who have a vehicle at camp are to turn their keys over to the dean.
- NO phones, pagers, radios, MP3 or CD players, video games, magazines, comic books, novels, or pets. Musical instruments are your own responsibility and not the camp's.
- Please keep in mind, as you are packing for camp, that you should glorify God in all you do and the way you dress. Shorts and skirts that are too short are not acceptable. Pants and jeans should not be too tight. Only modest T-shirts and tank tops that cover underclothing and the body appropriately may be worn — no spaghetti strap tank tops. No two-piece or immodest one-piece bathing suits are allowed. A long T-shirt or some other covering must be worn to and from the pool. If your style of dress is considered inappropriate by the dean or cabin parents, you will be expected to change.
- 7. Any damage to camp property will be the responsibility of those committing it.
- 8. Respect the property of others. Stay out of other people's belongings. We do not want practical jokes that will hurt and embarrass someone or damage property.
- All medicine is to be left with the camp nurse when you register. The nurse will dispense the medicine to the camper. (No person may be admitted to camp who has been exposed to a communicable disease, who has a contagious skin disease or who is subject to severe chronic disease.)
- 10. The telephone is to be used only with permission from the dean.
- 11. Visitors: In order to discourage homesickness and to keep the continuity of events, the Directors have made the following guideline:
 - Unregistered campers and parents are discouraged from visiting camp during the event. (Please check with the office as to whether designated "Visiting Times" are available.)
 - All visitors must register upon arrival and be approved by the Dean of that event.
 - Mail for your camper is encouraged. Be sure and put their name on the outside of the envelope.
- 12. Camper's conduct must reflect Biblical standards of purity. Promiscuity and harassment will not be tolerated.
